





Travellers in a rush will ride from Tolosenmäki directly to Rääkkylä village, but if you are travelling at a more leisured pace, you can turn to Jaamantie at about ten kilometres in to take a tour through Sangenlahti, Haapasalmi and Pötsönlahti.

This addition to your scenic route and its authentic rural landscapes with old stone barns will help you ease on the gas, and when you reach the Karjalanruusu garden, the sea of flowers will invite you to take a break and admire the scene. The colourful fields of Karjalanruusu are at their best and brightest in August and September. A true flower fan will schedule their trip to the

end of August, timing their visit to the Kukkakuhhaus flower festival.

In Rääkkylä, culture enthusiasts can stop by to admire one of the largest wooden churches in Finland. From the church steps, travellers can continue on to explore the four environmental art works in Oravisalo and Varpasalo islands. Pötsönlahti, on the other hand, is a great destination for children. Leikkimuseo Kotista is a play museum filled with toys and games of the past.

For nature lovers, the islands of northern Saimaa feature several bird-watching towers and five hiking trails with different themes,

all within a relatively small area. The three-kilometre Salpapolku, for example, combines military history with exercise in fresh air. The hiking path allows you to view structures built during the war as well as admire the heautiful nature of the Hämeenselkä shoreline. Some sites along the route include dugouts for accommodation and sauna bathing, trenches, a lean-to and a bird-watching tower. The path also features ITE art installations by Pekka Pitkonen and a touching piece of art by Leena Emilia Reittu, Perintö, 'Heritage'.

The largest ferry in Saimaa with a 150-tonne capacity, Nestori, started operating between Rääkkylä and Liperi in August 2020. Nestori transports passengers on a route known as Arvinsalmi ferry. The ferry route is almost half a kilometre long, and the ferry operates 24/7, if needed. In recent decades, many Finnish ferries have been replaced with bridges. Now, 40 ferry connections remain, only 15 of which at inland water areas. A ride on Nestori is therefore a rare treat for road travellers.



however, is the Eihvel Tower at the end of the cape, offering a beautiful view of the Finnish Lakeland.



The bird-watching tower, built by the Pohjois-Karjalan lintutieteellinen yhdistys ry bird-watching society, was completed at the end of Vuoniemi in Rääkkylä in autumn 2002. The narrow. beautiful Vuoniemi and its tower are an inviting destination not only to birdwatchers, but to all nature enthusiasts. Just taking in the esker formation that splits the open lake view from up high is enough of a reason to climb the 18-metre tower. The site also offers something for culture-lovers. In a fine weather, visitors can see the belltowers of three churches from the tower: Joensuu. Hammaslahti and Rääkkylä churches

At the other end of Vuoniemi, behind the pine trees covering the cape, rises Kirkkovuori, the hills of which have signs of life dating back to the Late Iron Age. Today, Kirkkovuori is part of a nature conservation area, as is most of Vuoniemi. In summer, lush greenery makes the steep landscape of Kirkkovuori look softer.

Vuoniemi is a cape that cuts through North Saimaa for several kilometres, separating Pyhäselkä from Orivesi's Jänisselkä. On Liperi's side, Vuoniemi's neighbour is Tikansaari. The less than 300 metres of water between them acts as a gate, a deep fairway south from Joensuu.

Thanks to this important fairway, tower visitors can also spot cargo ships in addition to birds.

The tower is also a great place to watch the spring and autumn migration of arctic birds. Many species of geese, waterfowls and waders pass over Vuoniemi every year.

Before the migratory birds arrive, however, the luckiest visitors may even spot a Saimaa ringed seal from the tower. The tip of Vuoniemi has been protected as a rocky resting area for Saimaa ringed seals. Approaching this area is prohibited from the beginning of November to the beginning of May.



HOW TO GET TO EIHVEL TOWER

In summers, you can ride to the end of Vuoniemi by car. Turn west towards Vuoniemi at Vahalahti, from road 484 between Rasivaara and Hammaslahti. Address for the navigator and Google Maps:

A DAY AT THE UNELMIEN UIMARANTA BEACH AND IDYLLIC MUSEUM AREA

You can start the most varied day of your summer holiday in Kirkkoniemi in Tohmajärvi, one of the most beautiful church spots in Finland. Near the oldest wooden church in North Karelia (1756), you can find signs for two nature trails. If you prefer more rigorous physical activity, you should head to the five-kilometrelong Kirkkoniemi Trail. By combining all three trails of the Karelian Trail network of Tohmajärvi, you can enjoy a well-marked 17-kilometre-long trail also suitable for mountain biking. On the Kirkkoniemi Trail, keep an eye out for the trail leading to the Peijonniemenlahti bird-watching tower, as it offers a view of a wetland area with a rich variety of birds.



If you prefer to enjoy nature at a more leisurely pace, you should choose the 65-kilometre-long Aconitum Trail. The trail is named after northern wolf's-hane which blooms in June and July. In Finland, it only grows in the wild in a few places in Tohmajärvi and Kitee. In ancient Finnish mythology, it was believed that Ukko, the god of the sky, would make a hat out of the topmost petal of the flower, which resembles a helmet

You should not follow Ukko's example, as not only is northern wolf's-bane classified as vulnerable, it is also highly poisonous and simply touching it may cause symptoms. The beautiful northern wolf's-bane is also vital for another threatened species, Bombus consobrinus, which is the only bumblebee species in Northern Europe to only feed on a single plant species.

The Aconitum Trail runs along a hard-surface road and a wide trail for a part of the way, but there is a section with narrow duckboards and a steep climb near the wolf's-bane meadow. To allow the beautiful flower and bumblebees to live in

peace, you should stick to the marked trail.

The Kirkkoniemi and Aconitum Trails follow the same path for a part of the way. Hikers may bump into each other while eating lunch at the Turusenniemi firepit. Both trails end at the foot of the church hill, where hikers can enjoy the child-friendly Unelmien Uimaranta beach, which opened in 2019.

The beach is only one meadow away from the church. The church is situated next to the 160-year-old congregation centre Pitäjäntupa, which now houses a café that is open every day in the summer.

VERSATILE NYMAN MUSEUM AREA

Walking five kilometres along Kirkkotie towards the town centre brings you to a charming museum area, the crown jewel of which is pharmacist Nyman's house, built in 1874. This building used to house the second oldest apothecary in North Karelia. Today, one end of the building houses the home and apothecary museum. The area features a total

of nine museum buildings: Nyman house, a granary, an outhouse building, Renkitupa, Tohmajärvi Parish Museum, the home cabin of Maiju Lassila, a drying barn, a wind mill and the Potsila barn.

The Nyman granary showcases the history and displays items related to healthcare in Tohmaiärvi through the 'From Cupping Therapy to Cannulation' exhibition There is an outhouse exhibition in the outhouse building built in 1876, which was a curiosity in Tohmajärvi at the time of its completion. The grandchildren of pharmacist Nyman are said to have sung as a group while sitting on the outhouse's multiple holes in summer. If this is not enough to bring a smile to your lips, you should visit the old barn's Potsi museum. which has more than a hundred pigs on the shelves.

I think all of us have had those sunny summer evenings that seem to invite us onto adventures, to take the road less travelled And what could be a more perfect depiction of Finnish summer than the rural landscapes seen in old Finnish films with the sound of gravel roads under the tyre in the background? The old milk docks, dark red bus stops and cow pastures along the village roads travelling across fields make this road an experience in itself.

There are many stories along these village roads in the heart of Karelia, ranging from love stories to moonshine making, but the strong Karelian roots of the region are what stand out: The

lively, bustling village communities with working bees and diverse events, the little shops and boutiques at the end of dirt roads, the buses of mobile shops and libraries waiting at the crossroads. These are the things and places where you can find true, authentic local life.

In the summer season, these village roads come alive with summer cafés, flea markets and various events. And even if you are travelling in the evening, going off the beaten track is worth it: who wouldn't rather enjoy a restful moment on the shores of a clear lake in the scent of freshly reaped grass than on an overpopulated, dirty resting area by a hot highway?

Pick up a few of the following hidden gems along the village roads in Sydänkarjala and fit them into your route plan. Then turn on the stereo and play some Nightwish – we are now at the band's place of birth, after all.


If you are looking for traditional lakeside views, you could drive from Puhos in Kitee to Papinniemi and then onwards towards the state border. The route follows the shoreline of Karelian Pyhäjärvi, known for its clear waters. Along the route, you can find attractions such as Neulaniemi recreational area (Neulaniementie 10, Juurikka) maintained by the Juurikka village association. Neulaniemi features a sandy beach, which is very well suited to families with children, with campfire spots and changing facilities. Juurikka village also has the Riuttavuori hiking trail(-Juurikantie 71, Juurikka). Its highest point has a lean-to with a fantastic view of the setting sun.

PS: Some fun trivia: the moonshine traditions of Kitee have strong roots in Juurikka, as the manufacturing of the oldest moonshine brand in the region, Juurikan Tähkä, started right here as far back as the 1640s.

If you want to rest your eyes on the rolling rocky hillsides, head towards Tohmajärvi. For example, you can drive along the border from Neulaniemi all the way to Värtsilä in Tohmajärvi. One stop along the way you should not miss is the Gallery Savipaja (Petravaarantie 562, Littilä) in the Orthodox village of Petravaara. From there, you can easily drive along the picturesque Perä-Muskontie to Kaurila to visit the Kaurila school museum (Koulunmäentie 17, Kaurila) and walk along Siirinpolku hiking trail, named after Siiri "Äitee" Rantanen, a former student of the school and an Olympic-winning cross-country skier. If you still desire more rural experiences, stop by the Saario Hydroelectric Plant Museum (Voimalaitostie 14), located by Jänisjoki river.

The clear waters and the exceptionally tame pikes and perches have attracted divers to Valkiajärvi in Kitee for decades. The lake is one of the clearest in Finland. after all. To celebrate the 100-year independence of our country, the Finnish Association for Nature Conservation chose the 100 greatest nature attractions in Finland, and Valkiajärvi was one of the sites on the list. Valkiaiärvi and its fish have also made it to the big screen the fish in the lake were the stars of the Tale of a Lake film released in 2016. The familiar pikes, perches and vendaces in the lake also have a rare friend a moss animal species called Cristatella mucedo

Scuba divers are especially taken by the lake's summer and autumn nights, which are full of life. Light is softer, then, and the fish are a little bit braver. You can also explore the underwater atmosphere and lake residents without scuba diving equipment. Even divers wearing simple snorkels or swimming goggles get to enjoy the rare horizontal

visibility, which reaches up to 30 metres

The feeling of the lake is calming, quiet and magical. The jetty is a meeting place for the calmly moving free divers, the scuba divers gearing up and the occasional swimmers alike. Something about the surroundings invites you to almost speak in whispers. Hopefully visitors will continue to cherish the calm serenity of this place.





HOW TO GET THERE

Turn to Himontie from highway 6 and drive for about 1.5 kilometres until you see the sign Valkiajärvi, pointing left. There is about a 200-metre walking distance from the parking area to the beach.



The Saaristo Trail is part of the Karelian Trail network completed in 2019. It meanders around the islands of Oravisalo and Varpasalo. The other Karelian Trails are a treat for mountain bikers, but the island trail is also suitable for cyclists with a more modest bike. The entire trail is 43 kilometres long if you explore every bend, but you can easily adapt the route as you wish.

There are six parking areas indicated on the Saaristo Trail map. The route is marked with red posts and Saaristo Trail signs. There is one well and two water refill stations along the route, but no shops or cafés. The pavement type changes as you cycle along: from small sand roads in a forest to short sections with a fresh layer of gravel, and sometimes also asphalt. The large hills are saved for other routes

Along the way, there are three pieces of wood art made of materials found on the islands and recycled for this purpose. To experience a duathlon based on military history, first walk the three-kilometre-long Salpapolku and then go see two of the memorials on Oravisalo island.

MILK DOCKS AND A RURAL IDYLL

This is the setting of The Land of Happiness, a film directed by Markku Pölönen. Pölönen explained the choice of setting in the Koti-Karjala newspaper: "Rääkkylä had retained the 1960s look the best There was no graffiti on the Kivisali stage, and there was roundpole fencing spanning probably hundreds of kilometres, as well as milk docks and old courtyards along the sand roads. Rääkkylä felt like home. The set designers did not have much work to do"

On the island of Varpasalo. the route dives into a farm setting. You should get off your bike and walk slowly through the courtyard, taking in the animals and lifestyle. The route really is designed to go through a farm. You may come across chickens in the yard and see dogs or cows in the fields. If you are not into farms, animals and their smell, you can choose another route, avoiding the southeastern corner of Varpasalo and cycling by a heach or a wetland area instead

HEINÄLAMMINOJA WETLAND

In the 1950s. Lake Heinälammi was drained in the hopes of gaining more farmland The end result was an unusable mire dotted with shrubs Between 2018 and 2020. a restoration project was carried out by seven landowners, local fishery cooperatives and many other parties, resulting in a wetland that becomes more beautiful year after year. Thanks to the restoration. the nutrient-rich water from nearby fields is filtered by the swamps along the shore, giving biodiversity another

You should stop and admire the wetland at the rest stop on top of a hill, where you can also find a piece of wood art called 'Sotka, sorea lintu' (Pochard, the elegant bird) from Aleksi Hyvönen's 'Quelavala – Kalevala' series. The wetland is designed to be an accessible attraction that you can reach by bicycle or car.




UNIQUE COLLECTION



KITEE ZOO

The fourth largest zoo in Finland is located by the Pajarinhovi tourist centre. The two-kilometre long scenic path familiarises the visitors with a total of 50 animal species (around 200 individual animals). Along the path, you will encounter the king of the forest, Riku the Bear, as well as bobcats, yaks, deer, alpacas, wild hoars and reindeer

FAMILY AND TRAFFIC PARK






MAIJU LASSILA CULTURE ROUTE

In summer 2018, the Maiju Lassila Culture Route was opened to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the author's birth. Maiju Lassila was the penname of Algot Tietäväinen, who was born and raised in Tohmajärvi. The route takes you to see many cultural and historical sites in Tohmajärvi by bike.

The basic route (15 kilometres) will take you to see an estate manor, the beautiful Kirkkoniemi and the services of the time. Kemie's beautiful rocky hill landscapes, lake views, the twisting roads and lush, green forests will show you the sights Algot fell in love with, too.

The additional route (25 kilometres) takes you to Algot's childhood home in Peijonniemi and the Nenosenlampi lake nearby.

The park surrounding the log manor familiarises you with dozens of different tree species. The garden also has many beautiful details from the Karelian-style buildings to enchanting artworks, such as the works of a Praznik Topora chain saw sculpting competition's Finnish championship held in summer 2020.

The area is a great way to see the diverse life cycle of wood from its growth stage all the way to a finished product.

The internationally notable sales exhibition features wood art, such as woodturning pieces, wood reliefs and

intarsia works, created by both Finnish and international artists. The exhibited works range from the traditional sculpted bears to modern, international sculptures. The current speciality is the world's first international Michael Jackson in wood art exhibition. The works created by a culturally diverse group of artists pay homage to Michael Jackson's wide-ranging artistic heritage and depict his artistry, talent, courage and humanity in multidimensional ways.

The gallery also sells jewellery, gift items and home goods, and it is an excellent place to find unique souvenirs and gifts. The manor's old barn is also a great place for a meal or coffee break or even for holding a meeting.

The history of Sirola Farm dates back to the 1960s and spans three generations. The operations were originally based on cattle, and milk production was continued until the 1980s.

The farm took the first step towards the sheep production it practises today when the farm was passed on to the next generation in 1990. For the first few years following the transition, the farm's main line of production was agriculture, but the farm switched to sheep farming in one go in 1994 after the arrival of the first 25 ewes and rams Paul and Pörri.

The organic sheep farm's current flock of sheep includes roughly 150 ewes and more than 20 rams, which represent all ram lineages in Finland. In addition to breeding animals of the Oxford Down breed,

Sirola Farm also produces lamb and mutton, processed meat products, wool and lambskin. The farm markets its lamb under the Sirolan Tilan karitsaa® brand. It is sold through restaurants and retailers as well as on location at Sirola Farm Shop.

The Farm Shop offers a wide selection of meat products ranging from lamb cuts to various processed and canned lamb products. The meat of the Oxford Down breed is very delicious, lowfat and has a mild flavour. As is typical for the breed, some of the fat is marbled inside the muscle tissues, guaranteeing a juicy flavour once cooked.

The products are truly made of local meat, as they are slaughtered only 30 km away in Puhos, Kitee. The fresh meat season takes place between July and November; at other times,

there is a limited amount of produce available as frozen food

The sheepskins obtained from the Oxford Down breed are thick, making them perfect for a variety of uses: for infants, grandparents or pets, for example. The thickness also means that the sheep produce a lot of wool. The wool produced by the breed does not felt easily; it is fine, long, thick and bouncy. These properties make it an excellent option for stuffing.

The farm's raw wool is processed by the spinning mill Pirtin Kehräämö in Hiirola, South Savo, amongst others. The Farm Shop's selection includes a wide range of yarns, felting wool and tuft yarn made by Pirtin Kehräämö. The Farm Shop also sells felt boots and slippers produced by the felt boot factory Lahtiset, as well as products made by local artisans.



The pastries by a bakery from Rasivaara, Kotileipomo Anu Hyttinen, have even been served at the Finnish Independence Day Reception!

Aside from Karelian pastries, the many bakeries in the area make many other sweet and savoury products that are in high demand. The savoury pastries baked inside a loaf of bread – kukko – by Kotileipomo Isabella in Rääkkylä are well-known around the country and have even brought home wins from the Finnish championships.

One good example of this is the river Mustolanjoki, located by Lake Pyhäjärvi in Karelia. Its fishing rights once belonged to the monks of Valamo Monastery. In spring, the monks would come at spawning time to fish in the waters of Mustolanjoki and Hanelinlampi, which have always been well-known spawning grounds for the common bream. The caught fish was then fermented in barrels and stored in storage pits in the ground for use in winter. The fermented fish stored by monks in storage pits had a bad odour but a good taste, similarly to the Swedish surströmming, i.e. fermented Baltic Sea herring. The common bream used to be such a prized fish that you were not even allowed to ring the church bells around spawning time.


Other traditional treats made in Sydänkarjala include dried fish and lutefisk (dried whitefish), which are based on Catholic teachings. The great popularity of fish back in the day was contributed to by factors such as people being forbidden from eating meat during Lent. Here is a fun piece of trivia: in the mid-16th century, Finland's most important export product was fish. Lutefisk made of dried Finnish northern pike in particular was highly prized in Central Europe and also served to kings and bishops and even at the Vatican.

Although fermented or dried fish or fish cured in lye is not part of many people's diet today, fish remains a popular ingredient and source of livelihood even now. This is evident in such things as the many local companies that offer processed fish products, such as Puruveden Savukala and Laukkasen Kala from Kesälahti, or Savumestari

Delicacies from Värtsilä, Tohmajärvi.

Sydänkarjala also offers experiences for those who enjoy fish dishes, as several restaurants in the area serve local fish. For example, the traditional salmon roasting and shore fish evenings held by the Ruokkeen Lomakylä holiday village have also attracted people from afar over the years. In the summer season, they are held on a weekly basis. The Paksuniemen Satamaravintola restaurant also has changing fish dishes on its daily lunch menu. The food is indeed local, as the fish is sourced from the production facilities of Kontion Kala. located next door.

If you would rather prepare a dish with lake fish by yourself to suit your tastes, that is also possible. You can buy fresh lake fish from the shop of Puruveden Savukala and Paksuniemen Satamapuoti. The selection varies due to the availability of the day.

KARELIANPOLUT PATHWAYS

is a hiking and cycling route network covering the entire Sydänkarjala region. The network offers a great setting for mountain biking, hiking, and trail running. Different routes have varying degrees of challenge, and exercisers of all fitness levels are sure to find a suitable one.

RIUTTAVUORI

A wonderful attraction in Juurikka, Kitee. The area around this popular site features short hiking trails through diverse terrain as well as a firepit. The top of the hill commands an amazing view of the sunset. The vista also includes the Riuttalampi pond at the base of the hill, Lake Juurikkajärvi a few kilometres away, and Lake Pyhäjärvi, which connects Finland and Russia. The view is incredibly impressive especially in autumn colours! Juurikantie 71, Kitee

KITEE WILDERNESS AND GAME PATH

travels through beautiful esker scenery along the shores of Orivesi. The two-part route comprises Parppeinlampi nature path (2.4 kilometres) and Hietaniemi wilderness path (2.3 kilometres) which both teach the hikers about the region's nature and animals. Along the path, you can find wood sculptures of animals, traps, fields and feeding areas for game animals and moose-watching towers. The area also has a hut, a lean-to, a covered eating area and a swimming beach, all available for public use.

THE SORTOLAMPI AND PITKÄLAMPI

area in Kesälahti offers diverse hiking routes travelling through changing terrain. The circular nature and culture paths offer visitors the following route options: Around Sortolampi (3.1 km), esker route of Pitkälampi (5.6 km), Palokangas route (8.0 km) and Pivanka path (3.7 km). The area also has a permanent orienteering route. Maps for the area are available from the joint service point of Kesälahti House, Mon-Fri 9 am-3 pm. Sortolammentie 1, Kesälahti

APAJALAHTI NATURE PATH

(2.8 km) in Varpasalo. Rääkkylä, travels through a privately-owned nature conservation area. The circular route is open to all visitors and features a public lean-to. Most of the path travels through one of the most beautiful black alder groves in Finland. Other protected sites in the area include the cliffs from ancient Saimaa. They can be slippery during rain, so remember to watch your step. The area is also inhabited by endangered white-backed woodpeckers. The nature path is also an excellent snowshoeing trail in the winter

SALPAPOLKU

(3 km) in Oravisalo, Rääkkylä, is a great recreational route for fans of military history, as it travels along the structures of the Salpalinja bunker line constructed on the eastern shore of Oravisalo. Salpalinja was a defensive bunker line built to protect Finland. The hiking path allows you to view structures built during the war as well

as admire the beautiful nature of the Hämeenselkä shoreline. Some of the historical structures have been renovated, and the area features sites such as dugouts for accommodation and sauna bathing, trenches, a lean-to, a bird-watching tower and a touching art piece by Leena Emilia Reittu, Perintö ('Heritage').

ACONITUM TOUR


(5.5 km) takes the travellers to the beautiful culture landscapes of Kirkkoniemi in Tohmajärvi, the wolf'sbane grove of Piilovaara and the bird-watching tower of Peijonniemi. Along the route, you can stop to read signboards sharing information about the diverse nature of Kirkkoniemi as well as its cultural history. The protected wolf's-bane grove in Piilovaara is the habitat of the plant that gave the tour its name: northern wolf'sbane, Aconitum lycoctonum. The plant is quite rare in Finland. The flower blooms in June and July, and it can only be discovered in seven places in the wild in Finland.

RIVER JÄNISJOKI

Tohmajärvi is a great destination for both canoeists and fishers. The waterways include a total of 200 kilometres of river and lake routes to paddle or row. In Värtsilä, the river crosses the state horder and continues on in Russia, towards Jänisjärvi where it finally flows into Lake Ladoga. Several rest areas have been built along the river to serve visitors that arrive both by the river and by land. The most popular sites in the fishing area are the Patsolankoski. Lempaankoski. Kattilakoski and Peltokoski rapids. Read more about the fishing permits needed online.

The Karelian Trails are a varied network of outdoor recreation trails. The newest routes, Akanpolku Trail and Sorpanpolku Trail, were completed in Tohmajärvi in autumn 2020. The network comprises ten routes and is designed for trail running, mountain biking and hiking alike. The routes are clearly marked with signs, with consideration to mountain bikers moving at high speed. Most of the Karelian Trails link naturally to local outdoor recreational routes and nature trails.

The Saaristo Trail in Rääkkylä offers kilometres of leisurely trails for cyclists without mountain bikes, taking them to the rural idylls of the islands of North Saimaa. Daredevils will particularly enjoy the elevation differences of more than 200 metres and the uphill and downhill sections that

put their equipment to the test on the Hutsi Trail in Kitee and the Pekan Trail in Tohmajärvi. In Sydänkarjala, mountain bikes are not stored for the winter; instead, cyclists can head to Kitee's Talvi Trail, which is cleared of snow for cyclists. The trails are categorised into three levels of difficulty: easy, moderate and challenging.

The newest additions to the network, Akanpolku Trail, start roughly ten kilometres southwest of Tohmajärvi. The more leisurely Akanpolku Trail is roughly 8 kilometres long, while the more challenging Sorpanpolku Trail is 11 kilometres long. You can combine the routes into a circular route, giving you over 13 kilometres of well-marked trail. Akanpolku passes by a beautiful



beach and fire pit on the shore of Lake Siikajärvi. On Sorpanpolku, you can take a break on top of the rugged Kypärävaara hill.

TOUR DE KARELIA MOUNTAIN BIKING COMPETITION

In autumn, the Karelian Trails are swarming with mountain bikers putting their fitness to the test in the Tour De Karelia event The competition has stages on trails in three different municipalities. Besides beautiful trails, the competition also offers excitement in the form of pursuit competitions. Participants are not required to have a racing licence. which makes Tour De Karelia an excellent way to get to know the sport.

IN TOHMAJÄRVI: NYMAN'S HOME

NYMAN'S HOME AND APOTHECARY MUSEUM

The crown jewel of the charming museum area in Tohmajärvi is Nyman's house built in 1874. This building used to house the second oldest apothecary in North Karelia. One of the building's rooms has been converted into an apothecary museum, and the other rooms have been turned into a home museum. Nyman's house and its other buildings feature both permanent and changing exhibitions. The old farmhands' chambers houses an exhibition of the Finnish singer Katri Helena and the granary has an exhibition of Maiju Lassila, the pseudonym of Finnish writer Algot Untola The café located in the farmhands' chambers lends bicycles and sports equipment to visitors.

WINTER BIKING IN KITEE

The five-kilometre long Talvi Trail in Kitee is a two-way, maintained winter cycling route with a medium challenge level, which is also suited to beginners. The trail is suited to fatbiking, trail running and hiking through beautiful winter forest scenery. The trail goes through rolling hills of birch and spruce forests. offering interesting terrain and a good amount of hills to climb. The starting point is on the health centre's parking area. TOUR SKATING

One of the most enchanting nature experiences of early winter comes when you pull on your skates and go tour skating on the crystal clear, frozen lakes. The region's extensive waterways provide excellent opportunities for tour skating, attracting visitors from both near and far. Safety should always be kept in mind when tour skating, however, and no one should go on these lake adventures alone. In the heart of winter, vou can skate several safe kilometres along the maintained tour skating tracks in Ruoke, Kesälahti, or Haapasalmi, Rääkkylä.

SNOW MOBILE RIDING

Sydänkarjala is well-known among snowmobile riders for its versatile and well-maintained tracks. There is even a saying that states that the best maintained trails can be found in 'Kittee and Kittilä'. In recent years, the track bases have been levelled with an excavator and cleared out, and new bridges and signposts have been built. In addition to these summer

renovations, the snowmobile tracks are also maintained actively during the winter season. There are cabins and rooms available for accommodation along the tracks, as well as places to eat. These safe kilometres are worth a visit even from farther away. You can purchase a permit to use the snowmobile tracks from Keski-Karjalan Moottorike-lkkailijat ry.

WINTER SWIMMING

Winter swimming is not only healthy, it is also part of Karelian sauna culture. Is there anything better than relaxing in a sauna after an active, successful day and then leaving the last dregs of your worries in a hole in the ice? Many tourists have tried winter swimming for the first time when staying with us, inspired by the locals' example. A gentle encouragement for any German, for example, is to say how the French visitors dared to take a dip just last week. Sydänkarjala has many places for winter swimming. both at rental cabins and during public sauna and

swimming hours held by various clubs and associations, such as Kesälahden talviuimarit at Lastu Sauna in Puhos, the congregation's camp centre in Hellaniemi, Kyläpari society at Heinäjärvi, Rääkkylän Kisa-Veikot in Paksuniemi and Tikkala village society at Veljesmaja.
